#### More about Dyslexia, Davis and Why this method

#### What is Dyslexia?

Dyslexia is **NOT** laziness, a bad attitude, not trying or not intelligent.

Dyslexia is an alternative way of thinking. Dyslexics think predominantly with pictures as opposed to the sounds of words. The difficulty is with two-dimensional symbols such as letters of the alphabet, numerals, musical notes and with the high frequency words such as; the, and, is, it, etc. These symbols can cause the picture thinker to feel confused.

The Davis® methods have been adopted by several schools in NZ, including an extensive programme at Kena Kena School, Kapiti Coast.

#### Why Davis Dyslexia:

The Davis methods deal with the root cause of dyslexia, which we call disorientation. Disorientation causes the brain to not see or not hear what is really there or being said. If you have heard a dyslexic to say; the words are running off the page, the page is blurry, or just to misread a word, then what has occurred is disorientation. For us, looking at that same print – it is not running off the page, nor is it blurry. But for the disoriented person, that is their perception and it makes continuing difficult.

The majority of Davis Dyslexia Correction Facilitators are the parents of dyslexics who have navigated their children through numerous programmes with little to no result. Ron Davis' book The Gift of Dyslexia made sense – we were able to recognize both our children in his description of dyslexics and we also could recognize the type of mistakes being made. Many will also comment that Ron's work has been developed for dyslexics BY a dyslexic. There are many programmes to 'help' developed by well meaning professionals – who do not think this way. We have come to this work after seeing the results in our own children.

To deal with the difficulty with more reading, phonetic training, or one of the many computer programmes and methods available, is to still be working with the disorientation that is occurring for the person you are trying to help.

Ronald Davis discovered and has developed simple mental techniques, either a visual or a kinesthetic method of correcting the distorted perceptions that occur – becoming oriented (focused)

The student is then taught symbol mastery with the clay to enable them to master the symbols – letters, numerals and words etc that have caused them difficulty. Once they understand these symbols the confusion and resulting disorientation becomes a thing of the past.






# Kena Kena School - Davis Dyslexia Programme Changes in Reading Age 2009 - 2011
